Our present focus is on proficiency in English, Computer Skills, finding job and internship opportunities, supporting to start businesses, education outside of the classroom through trips outside Delhi as well as events held within Delhi.

Pradeep Kumar, founder of Learning By Locals hails from a humble background. During his adolescent years, he received great support from an NGO, Manzil, based in Khan market, Delhi. When he started his touring business, Delhi By Locals, he wanted to use the 50% of the profits to give back to the community. He realised the importance of the support he received and aimed to provide the same for the youth who don't have access to opportunities. He started taking classes in the Sanjay Colony, a slum in Okhla, Delhi. Most of the families here are from lower income group working in factories. Youth here goes to the government schools with very limited resources for any additional learning opportunity. We officially registered the NGO 'Learning By Locals' in September 2017. It was inaugurated by Ravi Gulati, his mentor and founder of Manzil. This is the beginning of a journey that will touch thousands of lives and make a remarkable difference for many. We would like to share our story with you and hence this newsletter will make you a part of us. Looking forward to a mutually fulfilling partnership!

We capped it off with a tour of Agra Fort at sunset to relish the gloried past of the Mughal kings. It was a tour full of smiles, laughs, learning and bonding that won't be forgotten. 
OUR CLASSES

English Learning English is crucial to increase employability and gain confidence. Therefore spoken and written English classes are our main focus here. A regular class happens three days a week and a special discussion class on Saturday & Sunday. These classes enrol students based on their present command over the language and not on age. This class attracts maximum students and we are grateful to our volunteers for their consistency and making these classes so interactive.

Computers Computer skills have become essential in this digital age. We have basic classes where we learn keyboard typing, MS Office and advanced classes where students learn programming and even had a workshop on robotics.

Business Development Women from the locality lack awareness to become self dependent. Our volunteer Ronita, helps them by providing necessary guidance and support to start their own business and become financially independent. She held a 4-week pilot program, based on global curricula in the space + personal experiences, to help more women and girls launch their ideas. The girls learnt a lot and were able to share exciting ideas for their future entrepreneurial endeavours.

Theatre Theatre provides the expression needed to bring out the best in oneself. Every Sunday we have theatre classes where kids not only learn to act, engage in various creative activities but are also learning script writing. This class engages students in creative writing exercises and they also improvise while they act. This class is packed with oodles of energy and fun.
